## Next Sunday is Palm Sunday and

### A holy day of obligation



Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.

Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect.

Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday.

The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

A week later, Christ would rise from the dead on the first Easter.

During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion.

**Understanding the Gift of Plenary Indulgences** begins with recognizing why one is needed in the first place: **Sin**. Sin encompasses intentional thoughts, words, deeds, or omissions that contradict God's law of loving goodness. Whenever we choose to sin, we bring upon ourselves the consequences of our actions. These consequences may vary, depending on the nature of the sin. However, regardless of the severity, all sins inflict some degree of harm upon our souls, damage our relationships with others, and most significantly, impact our relationship with God both in this life and the next. Fortunately, we are blessed with a merciful and loving Father who generously forgives us. He grants us His saving help, called 'grace', enabling us to overcome sin and enjoy eternal life with Him in heaven.

But how do we receive God's grace? He imparts this grace to us through His Church. We receive it through the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion, as well as through prayer and various other means. One such means is the reception of an Indulgence. **An Indulgence is the partial remission of the consequences of our sins, achieved through the Church's intercession on our behalf before God.** The Pope, as the head of the Body of Christ, has the authority to grant us indulgences, serving as a manifestation of God's abundant mercy.

A Plenary Indulgence, though, differs from an ordinary Indulgence in that it goes a step further. **Plenary Indulgences cover the entirety of the temporal consequences of our sins. This encompasses both the earthly ramifications and the eternal ones - meaning no Purgatory for us! However, it is important to note that a Plenary Indulgence is not a "get out of jail free" card nor a license to freely engage in sin. True contrition remains an essential condition for receiving an Indulgence.**

## Plenary Indulgence during time of Eucharistic Revival & Jubilee celebration of St. Thomas Aquinas

One may make pilgrimage to a church or oratory under the patronage of St. Thomas Aquinas to obtain this indulgence. By making a visit during this special double jubilee period, continuing now through January 28th 2025. One may obtain a plenary indulgence each day for their own soul or for a soul in purgatory under the three usual conditions:

Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and offering prayers for the pope's intentions.

**Or** by making pilgrimage/visit to St. Thomas Aquinas church and spend a considerable amount of time in prayer concluding with the Lords Prayer, The Creed and Invocation to the Blessed Mother and St. Thomas Aquinas.
