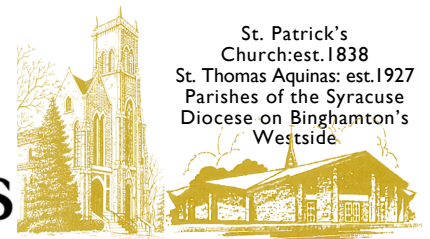


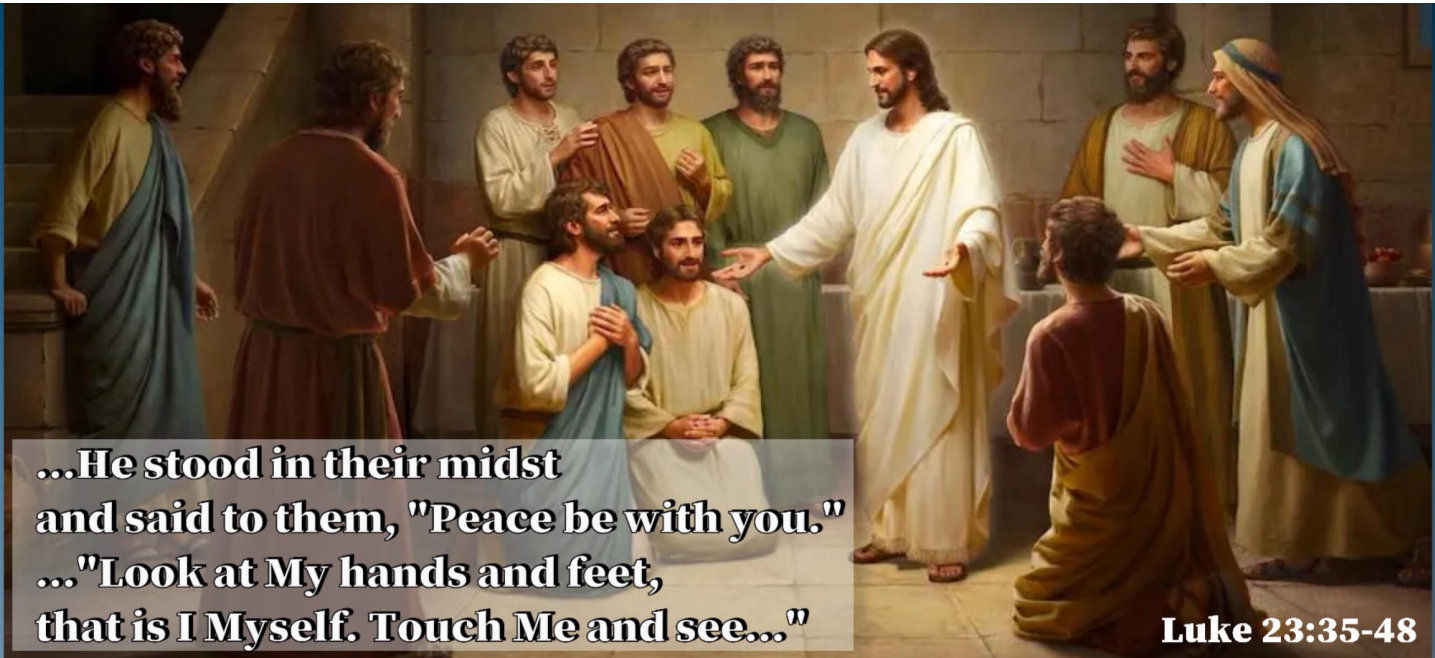

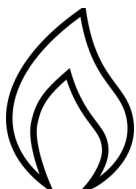
Pastoral Care is available for Homebound, Hospital and Nursing Home Visitation

The Mass: Structure and Meaning

Over the next several weeks we will take a special feature look at the parts of the Mass as offered by the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops); In hopes to increase our love and appreciation for the Holy Sacrifice of our Lord.

The Homily....

Is for the nurturing of the Christian life.

It should be an explanation of some aspect of the readings from Sacred Scripture or of another text from the Ordinary or the Proper of the Mass of the day and should take into account both the mystery being celebrated and the particular needs of the listeners.

The homily should ordinarily be given by the Priest Celebrant himself or be entrusted by him to a concelebrating Priest or if appropriate to the Deacon but never to a lay person. In particular cases and for a just cause, the homily may even be given by a Bishop or a Priest who is present at the celebration but cannot concelebrate.

On Sundays and Holydays of Obligation there is to be a homily at every Mass and it may not be omitted without grave reason. On other days it is recommended, especially weekdays of Advent, Lent and Eastertime as well as on other festive days and occasions when people come to church in great numbers. If appropriate for a brief periods of silence to be observed after the Homily.

Formation for Ministry Online Program Info Session

Sunday, April 21st 1pm SVBS, Vestal

"Lay persons who devote themselves permanently or temporarily to some special service of the Church are obliged to acquire the appropriate formation which is required to fulfill their function properly...Inadequate and faulty formation harms rather than helps the mission of the Church." (Co-Workers in the Vineyard of the Lord, pp. 33, 34).

Our baptism calls us to serve others in the Church and the Formation for Ministry Program prepares candidates to hear, discern and accept that call. The two-year Formation for Ministry program prepares adults of mature faith to assist pastors to serve the needs of the church. It also serves as the first two years of preparation for the permanent diaconate.

The Formation for Ministry program provides education, ministerial training, field experience, and spiritual preparation for adult Catholics leading to certification and commissioning by the diocesan bishop in a specialized area of ministry. The program prepares candidates to assist pastors to serve the needs of a parish or pastoral care area. The program also serves as the first two years of deacon formation. Formation for Ministry also offers learning opportunities for adult Catholics who seek to learn more about their faith for their own personal enrichment.
