





#### The Mass: Structure and Meaning

Over the past and next several weeks we are taking a special feature look at the parts of the Mass as offered by the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops); In hopes to increase our love & appreciation for the Holy Sacrifice of our Lord.

We have presented thus far: Introductory Rites; Entrance Procession; The Penitential Act; The Kyrie; The Gloria; The Collect; The Liturgy of the Word: first reading, responsorial psalm, second reading and Gospel; The Homily; Profession of Faith and now...

### The Liturgy of the Eucharist

At the Last Supper Christ instituted the Pascal Sacrifice and banquet, by which the Sacrifice of the Cross is continuously made present in the Church whenever the priest, representing Christ the Lord, carries out what the Lord himself did and handed over to his disciples to be done in his memory.

For Christ took the bread and the chalice, give thanks, broke the bread and gave it to huis disciples, saying: Take, eat and drink: this is my Body; this is the chalice of My Blood. Do this in memory of me.

Hence the Church has arranged the entire celebration of the Liturgy of the Eucharist in parts corresponding to precisely these words and actions of Christ, namely.

### **RCIA—Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**

Adults who are interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith are invited to participate in this process. Please call the rectory to indicate your interest.

### RCIC- Rite of Christian Initiation for Children

Families with children who may be out of sequence with their celebration of the Sacraments or who may need special attention are welcome to participate in RCIC.

Typically 2nd grade is reserved for Reconciliation and First Holy Communion and 10th grade for Confirmation, although preparation actually begins in the prior years—1st & 9th grade respectively.

If your child is out of sequence, no worries, we can work with children and their families through RCIC. Please call the rectory to indicate your interest.

# <u>Plenary Indulgence during time of Eucharistic Revival & Jubilee celebration of St. Thomas Aquinas</u>

One may make pilgrimage to a church or oratory under the patronage of St. Thomas Aquinas to obtain this indulgence. By making a visit during this special double jubilee period, continuing now through January 28th 2025. One may obtain a plenary indulgence each day for their own soul or for a soul in purgatory under the three usual conditions: Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, an offering prayers for the pope's intentions **Or** by making pilgrimage/visit to St. Thomas Aquinas church and spend a considerable amount of time in prayer concluding with the Lords Prayer, The Creed and Invocation to the Blessed Mother and St. Thomas Aquinas.

<u>RCIA or RCIC:</u> Interested in becoming Catholic? Interested in having your children make their Sacraments? For inquiries regarding Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults or for Children, please call the parish office.

<u>Marriage:</u> Couples should call the parish secretary at least six months in advance. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act, appropriately held in a public liturgy at church. Catholics are urged to celebrate their marriage within the Eucharistic Liturgy.
